

- during storytelling




Engaging children with creative play and questions that involve participation throughout the process.



Ask students to close their eyes with their hands and open only when you count to three!



Ask students this question: What months come after September? (Answer: October, November, December)



Point out where the acorn is. Who is holding it and where did it go?

(Answer: Hedgehog and it fell down!)



Make a splashing sound!



Point at your best friend/friends.


Instructions:


1.2 Recollect The Items!


Instructions:

Display a collection of 10 random items and ask students to observe them for 15 seconds. After that, cover the items with a piece of cloth. Get students to write down what they remember on a piece of paper and see if they can remember all 10 items!

What students will learn:

Improve memory skills and mental cognitive abilities.











1.3 Months of the Year


Instructions:

Give each student a piece of paper containing the name of the month. Let them rearrange themselves in one line from the first to the last month. Now recite the months in order together in class!

What students will learn: Identifying the different months of the year and improving students memory!




2.1 The Balancing Act

Divide students in small groups. In each group, give every student a piece of newspaper. Ask students to stand on the newspaper and balance within their newspaper. Count to three.

If one person falls out of their newspaper in the group, the group loses. Continue the game by folding the newspaper in half each time. The last group with everyone standing within their newspaper is the winner.

What students will learn: Improving and developing balancing skills.

2.3 Pinecone Hedgehogs

Instructions:

What students will learn: Enhance creativity and encourage imaginative thinking.



Materials Needed:


- 1. Pinecone 4. Strong adhesive glue
- 2. Felt cloth (Any colour) 5. Brush
- 3. Scissors



How to:



First, prepare all your materials.




Take a piece of coloured felt and cut a triangular face shape with a pair of scissors.



Out small pieces of black and white felt for the eyes. Cut another triangle for the nose.



Apply some glue at the back of the eyes and nose.



Next, glue all the facial parts on top of the face.



6 Finally, apply glue on the pinecone and paste the face on the surface of the pinecone.






3.1 Memorable Moments




