

# ACTIVITIES

# - during storytelling



Engaging children with creative play and questions that involve participation throughout the process.




Ask students to point out the Little Red Hen, Rooster and Rat.



2 Encourage students to chime in when the hen's friends say "Not I" and "Then I'll do it myself" (maybe have half of the class say what the rooster and mouse say, and the other half say what the little red hen says)



Use hand motions to show specific action words. e.g. stirred, kneaded

The levels are based on the difficulty and time length of each activity.










## 1.1 Help the Hen

#### Instructions:

### 1.2 Chick-Fil-A


#### Instructions:

# 1.3 Feeling Flour-ish!

#### Instructions:

Provide flour to make dough or give each student a piece of dough and let them play with it for a short while. Ask them the questions below.

- 1. How does the flour feel?
- 2. Smell the flour. How does it smell?
- 3. What does it taste like? Does it taste like bread?

Acknowledge each answer by writing them down on the whiteboard.

What students will learn:

Activating the student's sensory play as they touch, smell and taste the flour.

### 2.1 Whole Wheat World


#### Instructions:

Using Play-Doh, plasticine or modelling clay, ask students to make different types of bread of the world.

#### What students will learn:

Allows students to expand their mind by learning the different types of bread around the world!

# 2.2 Arrange the Sticks

#### Instructions:

Draw the characters on the ice cream sticks and arrange the sticks to form a complete picture.

#### What students will learn:

Provides the basis for creativity and problem solving skills by arranging the sticks in the correct sequence.



### Materials Needed:

- 1. Marker Pens
- 3. Masking Tape
- 2. Wooden Ice Cream Sticks



### How to:



First, get your materials ready.




Next, arrange the wooden sticks together side by side. Tape the left and right sides of the sticks using masking tape to ensure the sticks are in place.



Flip to the side without the masking tape. Take your marker pen and start to draw a character on the sticks. Once you are done, remove both sides of the tape from the sticks.



You have finally created your own puzzle sticks. Enjoy piecing the puzzle!









# 2.3 Bread-making Machine

Draw a mystery machine that bakes the bread. Label parts of the machine.

What students will learn:

Brings out the hidden inventor or engineer in students - by brainstorming ideas to create and design their machine.

To begin this project, simply prepare papers and colouring materials such as coloured pencils, crayons and marker pens and start drawing!












### 3.1 Read Between the Lines

### How to make dough:



First, prepare 1 cup of flour, 1/2 cup of water and a tray. (Alternative to tray: big bowl)



Next, pour some flour on the tray.



Make a hole in the flour and pour some water in. Mix it well until it becomes dough.




Lastly, knead your dough until it becomes smooth.




