


ACTIVITIES

- during storytelling




Engaging children with creative play and questions that involve participation throughout the process.


Ask students where each animal lives. For example, the land, sea or air. This question can be asked throughout the pages of the book!

Think of your favourite animal and draw yourself with that animal!


What students will learn:

1.2 My Animal Catalog



1.3 Tracing Steps


Instructions:

Instructions:

What students will learn:

Nurtures creativity in craft and storytelling in students.



Ask students to hold their cups in front of their noses and act like the animal for their peers to guess!

- 3. Marker pens

If you have more ideas in mind, make more animal noses!








2.3 Spelling Bee

The team that gets the most correct answers wins!


3.2 Animal Habitat
