

- during storytelling




Engaging children with creative play and questions that involve participation throughout the process.




Ask students to show their feet.

Instructions:

Make a garden full of bunnies with the simplest materials.

What students will learn:

Learning how simple materials such as toilet rolls can be useful for creating sustainable art.


Besides using toilet rolls, try experimenting with different sizes of paper cups tool



Materials Needed:

- 1. Art paper
- 3. Paint
- 2. Empty toilet rolls
- 4. Marker pens

How to:



Get your materials ready!



Dip the toilet roll in paint and stamp a circle as the face of a bunny.



Slightly flatten another toilet roll to make the ears of the bunny.



Draw cute faces and make more bunnies!







1.2 Hoppity Hop

Instructions:

A speed game that also requires teamwork.

What students will learn:


A good way to learn how to work together in a team.

Materials Needed:

For two teams, 4 hula hoops & 2 cones

How to:

- 1. Get students into two groups and form a line in each group.
- 2. Arrange 2 hula hoops and 1 cone in each line.
- 3. Every student will have to hop like Harris into 2 hula hoops and make a complete turn around the cone before running back to their group.
- 4. The fastest team to complete wins!



1.3 Hopping Animals


Instructions:

2.1 On Your Feet!


Instructions:



What students will learn:

Trains hand-eye coordination as students assemble their craft.



Materials Needed:

- 1. Ice-cream sticks
- 5. Paper

9. Mini pom poms

2. Paint

- 6. Black marker pen
- 10. Pipe cleaners

- 3. Paint brushes
- 7. Scissors

4. Glue

8. Cotton wool



How to:



Prepare your materials.



Paint your ice-cream stick with any colour!



With a black marker pen, draw funny bunny teeth and cut them out.



Glue everything together! Attach the teeth, then the whiskers and lastly, the pom poms.

3.2 The Four Seasons


Instructions:

3.3 Food Chain


Instructions:
